RIGHTS IN PLAY

Copyright

- For literary, dramatic, artistic and musical works as well as performances, sound recordings and communication signals
- Different actions require authorization and can be parsed, these include:
 - The right to perform the work in public
 - The right to produce or reproduce the work
 - The right to synchronize with another performance or work

Moral rights

• The right to the integrity of the work and to be associated with the work (where reasonable)

Personality rights

- Including use of image and likeness
- Venue



THE PLAYERS

Content (the underlying work)

o Authors/playwrights, choreographers, songwriters, publishers, recording artists, labels

• Performance

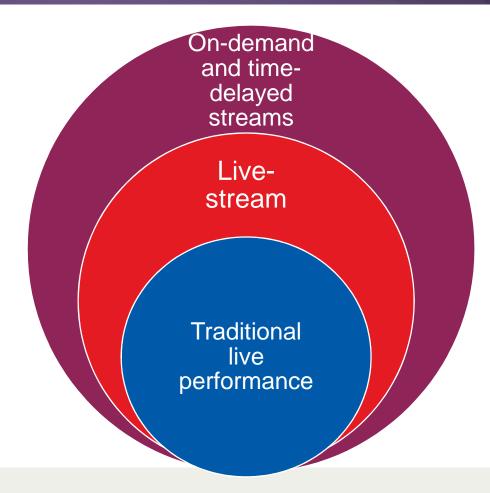
o Performers and creative crew

• Personality rights

 - Ex. collective societies and unions



WHAT RIGHTS DO YOU NEED?





TRADITIONAL LIVE PERFORMANCES

1. Copyright in the content

- The right to perform the work in public
- Perhaps limited reproduction rights for specific purposes

2. Copyright in the performance

 Contract with performers and creative crew (Directors, lighting, choreographer, etc)

3. Personality rights

4. Venue

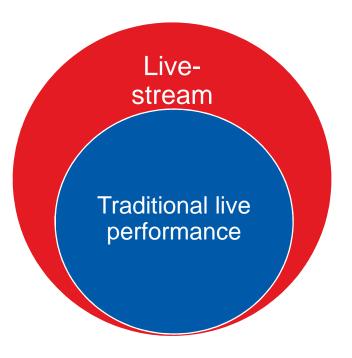
Traditional live performance





LIVE-STREAM OF PERFORMANCE

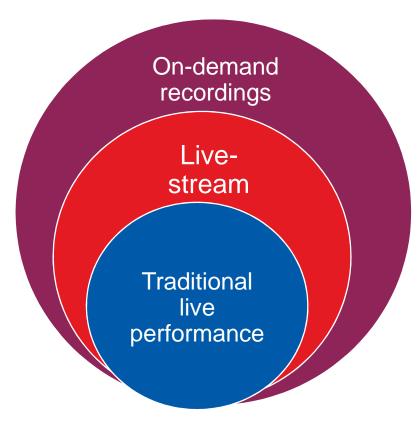
- All rights applicable to traditional live performances plus permission for additional uses will be required
- Contracts with all parties should include livestreamed performances
- Considerations include: platform/website, geoblocking, limited or wide access (incl. password protection)





ON-DEMAND VIDEO OF PERFORMANCE

- All rights and considerations applicable to traditional live performances and live-streamed performances plus:
 - The right to reproduce the work(s)
 - Sync licenses may also be required
- Also consider term of license (how long will performance be posted)





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
